EDUCATIONAL · CHOICE · SCHOLARSHIP · PROGRAM · (EDCHOICE)

- Scholarships are only for students in low-performing public schools – there are 11 public schools designated as low-performing in the Akron Public Schools
- Scholarship maximum is \$4,500 for grades K-8 and \$5,300 for grades 9-12
- Nearly 10,000 students use the scholarship statewide, with 338 using the scholarship in Akron
- Parents can choose from 16 participating private schools in Akron
- Scholarship program began in 2005

STUDENTS · ATTEND · QUALITY · SCHOOLS · AND · CONTINUE · TO · TAKE · STATE · ASSESSMENTS

- All private schools that accept EdChoice students adhere to the State Board of Education’s Operating Standards of Ohio’s Schools
- As part of the Ohio Operating Standards, all teachers at private schools hold teaching credentials and licenses, just like public school teachers.
- All students who receive the EdChoice Scholarship take the Ohio Achievement Tests and the Ohio Graduation Test.
